## Dear Appropriations Committee Member:

Our Committee has been hard at work since we held our organizational meeting in February. We have taken seriously our responsibility to conduct oversight of taxpayer dollars. We have held 76 hearings in the last two months with more than 200 witnesses, including 17 cabinet-level officials. Even though the President's Budget was delayed, you and your staff have been working around-the-clock reviewing proposals line-by-line.

We also modified the Community Project Funding criteria to require a federal nexus and to make the process even more transparent and less controversial. At this time, 85% of the House of Representatives has requested projects that will directly impact our constituents and communities.

Now is the time to enter our next phase: markups. In an effort to keep you informed of upcoming Committee business, this letter provides notice of dates to hold on your calendars for Subcommittee and Full Committee markups.

Many of you noted that you had to miss important events in your districts when the Committee held markups while the House was not in session. I developed the draft schedule below to avoid that scenario as much as possible.

While this schedule is preliminary and subject to change, my current plan is to conduct Subcommittee and Full Committee markups from May 17<sup>th</sup> through June 15<sup>th</sup>. Please hold the following dates on your calendars:

- May 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> Subcommittee markups will be scheduled on these dates and are expected to be finished by the time votes end on May 18<sup>th</sup>.
- May 23<sup>rd</sup>, 24<sup>th</sup>, and 25<sup>th</sup> Full Committee markups will be scheduled on these dates and are likely to go well into the afternoon and evening. Members are expected to remain in Washington, D.C. after votes on Thursday, May 25<sup>th</sup>, as these markups will not be completed by the time votes end on May 25<sup>th</sup>. At this time, I recommend reserving transportation back to your districts on Friday, May 26<sup>th</sup>, instead of Thursday, May 25<sup>th</sup>.

- June 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Subcommittee markups will be scheduled on these dates and are expected to be finished by the time votes end on June 8<sup>th</sup>.
- June 13<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup>, and 15<sup>th</sup> Full Committee markups will be scheduled on these dates and are likely to go well into the afternoon and evening. Members are expected to remain in Washington, D.C. after votes on June 15<sup>th</sup>, as these markups will not be completed by the time votes end on Thursday, June 15<sup>th</sup>. At this time, I recommend reserving transportation back to your districts on Friday, June 16<sup>th</sup>, instead of Thursday, June 15<sup>th</sup>.

Thank you in advance for your cooperation as we complete our Committee's work. I look forward to working with you to develop appropriations bills for Fiscal Year 2024.
